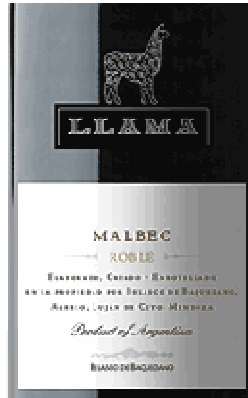


Belasco de Baquedano

2007 Llama Malbec



WINERY:

The Agrelo District of the Lujan de Cuyo region, considered one of the most important vineyard districts of Argentina - particularly optimum for Malbec, is 3,346 feet above sea level offering outstanding natural conditions for the production of premium wines, with fine-grained sandy soil considered the best in the province. The warm days, offset by cool nights plunging by as much as 45°F creates an extraordinary variance that enhances the richness of wine's aroma/flavor, and deepens color. With very little rainfall, there is no shortage of water thanks to the proximity of the Andes. The vineyards have 222 acres exclusively for Old Vine Malbec. The vines are 100 years old.

DESCRIPTION:

As its namesake, this wine embodies the distinctive spirit of the vineyards, spanning the foothills of the Andes. Llama is a rich ruby-purple color, and boasts elegant flavors of black berries, ripe plum and robust spices with good balance and structure.

COOPERAGE:

24-48 hours pre-fermentative cold, 10 days post-fermentative at 28°C. Native yeast, 24°C, 8 days. 6 months in French oak, 6 months in bottle.

HARVEST:

By hand.

BLEND:

100% Malbec

PRODUCTION:

15,000 cases

ANALYSIS:

Alcohol 13.6%, T.A. 5.05 g/l, pH 3.7, R.S. 1.51 g/l
